

One day dedicated to international solidarity

Within the framework of the international solidarity's week, Chemins d'Enfances (CDE) organized one open day in SCEAUX.

Objectives of the action proposed by Chemins d'Enfances

1. To sensitize in a ludic way the area's inhabitants to international solidarity
2. To sensitize Sceaux' children and the neighborhood cities to the Child's Rights
3. To arouse children and adults' interest towards other cultures
4. To promote projects directed towards the greatest interest of the child through innovative play, artistic and educational activities.

Activities put in place

Children discovered games from here and abroad, listened to world's music and immersed themselves in Asia via tales. A drawing competition on the topic of the Rights of the Child was organized.

The action of Chemins d'Enfances in Indonesia and South Asia as well as its methodological approaches were presented to the parents.

Drawing competition

The birthday of the International convention of the **Rights of the Child** was celebrated a few days before and the drawing competition was a means to sensitize the children to this question.

Divided in small groups, the children were asked whether they heard about Child Rights. Then, they were led to think about what, according to them, was the most important thing to ensure to all children around the world and, they were instructed to draw it in a way that their message could be understood in different languages and cultures.

A jury made up of 5 personalities representing Sceaux or associations connected with India and Indonesia choose the three best drawings by categories (less than 6 years old; 6 to 8 years old; 9 years old and more). The criteria of selection was the relevance of the illustration of the Rights of the Child.

The three winners of each category received a diploma signed by the president of CDE and the mayor of Sceaux.

In addition, the children choose a gift among various objects from India or Indonesia.

The drawings were sent to our partners in India and Indonesia which, in return, will send us the best drawings of their children.
